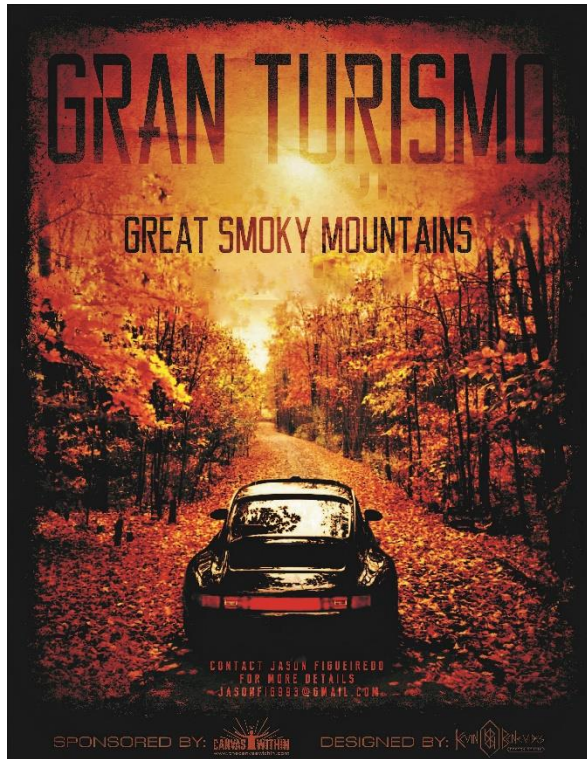


SMOKY MOUNTAIN GRAN TURISMO

Day 1:

Toronto – Rock & Roll Hall of Fame (Cleveland, Ohio) – Lexington, KY.

We depart the GTA area and drive to the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. After touring the museum, we'll go to our boutique hotel in the heart of Lexington, Kentucky.

Day 2:

Lexington, KY – Knoxville, TN

After the first day of interstate driving, today, we head into the mountains. Leaving our boutique hotel, we drive to the Boone National Forest and explore the beautiful twisty roads our cars were designed for. We'll have one interesting historical stop along the way, before driving a historical 1930's road. We'll arrive that afternoon at our historical boutique hotel in downtown Knoxville, Tennessee. You'll have the time to explore the downtown core, the historic Market Square or catch a show at the historical 1928 Tennessee Theatre.

Day 3:

Knoxville, TN – Asheville, NC

Leaving our boutique hotel, we enter the Smoky Mountain range to drive some of the best roads east of the Rocky Mountains, which includes the Blue Ridge Parkway before we arrive at the historic Omni Grove Park Inn for two nights.

Day 4:

REST DAY

There is no scheduled drive today. Enjoy the day on your own to explore the town of Asheville, the historic Biltmore Estate and its winery or the day at the Grove Park Inn.

Day 5:

Asheville, NC – Hot Springs, VA

Leaving the Smoky Mountain range, we enter the Appalachian Mountains for more challenging roads. Lunch will be at a unique location before we arrive at the Omni Homestead Resort. This historic resort dates back to 1766. For those interested in history, you can still take a plunge in the historic 1761 Jefferson Hot Springs a short distance from the hotel. It is one of the oldest spa structures in existence in the USA.

Day 6:

Hot Springs, VA – Canadian Border.

Leaving Virginia, we travel toward the Canadian border along more excellent roads. Lunch will be at a unique location before we return to Canada.
