

ne of the more popular mottos in the Porsche Club of America is that "It's all about the people, not the cars." The benefits of Porsche ownership go far beyond the pleasure of driving a Porsche. Membership in the PCA helps owners to connect with like-minded individuals who truly care about their fellow PCA members.

Hazel and I decided to attend two Driver Education events at Calabogie and Le Circuit Mont Tremblant to re-connect with dear friends from the USA. PCA DE events draw their participants from many regions and some members plan well ahead to attend specific events. We could have gone to the 2010 PCA Parade, but we knew that the former DE Track Chair of the Northeast region, now living in San Antonio, would be at LCMT and our great friends from the Potomac Region wanted to experience the challenges of learning two Canadian tracks.

So here we are at the ever-improving track facilities at Calabogie Motorsports Park (CMP), at a PCA DE event co-hosted by the Northeast, Rennsport and the North County regions of Zone 1. This is the fourth season since the Calabogie track opened for business and it seems to be evolving very nicely. Bruce Gregory should be commended for his ongoing commitment to make Calabogie a world-class motorsports park. Back in 2006 there were no facilities at the track with the exception of a couple of portable potties. Race control was in a trailer and there was no PA system. Today I'm sitting on the second floor of the air-conditioned race control tower with an excellent view of the pit straight. The CMP main administration building has four rental accommodation suites, washrooms with shower facilities and there's even an art gallery on the top floor of this multi-storey building.

There is also a large new building at the west side of the paddock that houses a brand new garage managed by Jim Hoddinott, the dealer principal of Kanata Ford in Ottawa. Jim's a Porsche fanatic as well, and his trackside shop, Speed Merchants Motorsports, features state-of-the art technical services, including tire mounting and balancing. They also have a fully stocked retail store with hundreds of track, race and street tires, Porsche parts, safety equipment and race clothing. CMP has certainly morphed into an oasis in the otherwise desolate and remote Madawaska Highlands area of Renfrew County.

Unfortunately for us, Hazel's engine failed on the second morning of this 3-day event. As we've experienced at previous events, we received several offers of assistance from fellow PCA'ers from NER, who offered to loan Hazel their tow vehicles and trailers so she could transport her car back to Toronto. In the end, Jim arranged a more convenient plan which had Hazel's 997 trucked back to the dealer in Toronto. We were also able to have her trailer hitch installed on my GT3 so that we could continue on to another PCA DE event at Le Circuit Mont Tremblant. I also bought new rear Pagid brake pads and a replacement track tire and got them all installed at this trackside shop. Incredibly, Hazel was also loaned a 2007 Carrera for her to use for the remainder of the event and for the following DE event at LCMT from a very generous Rennsport member. This is yet another example of the special camaraderie that exists at PCA events: demonstrating, yet again, that "it's all about the people". This is why I urge you to consider attending an out-ofregion DE. The experience will be incredible and you will make new friends from all over whom you might never have met otherwise.

The 2010 PCA Parade was kind to the Upper Canada Region as we were awarded trophies in two categories. We finished second place in the best website competition and we tied for third place in the newsletter category. Kudos should go to Otto Mittelstaedt, Kye Wankum and Phil Downe who are the UCR Volunteer Directors who made this all happen.

t long last I experienced my first Driver's Education Weekend at Mosport on May 15-16. I will call it an amazing weekend only because I'm not smart enough to think of a word that adequately conveys something beyond amazing. It was the most fun I've ever had in a car, clothes on or off. I know that many Provinz readers are old pros who go to the track every chance

they get. I offer a different perspective. These are the observations of first-timer at the track. If you have often thought about registering for a track weekend but have never signed up, read on. I know that from the outside it seems a little intimidating and overwhelming but trust me, it's not. If I can do it, you can do it. I hope that the below helps to push you past your hesitation.

be on the track, and so concerned about hurting yourself and your car that your instructor, no matter how good, just kind of fades into the background. By the last session on Saturday afternoon, however, I had settled down a bit and Phil was beginning to enter my consciousness.

I was never made to feel like a rookie or a new-comer. Even though your rookie status is evident from your green bracelet, all involved, from the instructors to former racers make you feel at home and part of the fraternity. Nobody brags about how fast they are and everyone seems focused on having fun. The experienced "trackies" were very helpful with tips on everything from tire pressures to where to go for supper and where to get gas.

Let's start with my instructor. Phil White.

He was great. Phil was calm, soft-spoken and somehow capable of maintaining his composure and good nature, while strapped into a car with a novice like me. I'm confident that Phil was being a dutiful instructor offering helpful advice and guidance the whole weekend but, to be honest, I didn't really pay him that much attention at first. And that's not a reflection on Phil. For your first couple of track sessions you are so pumped with adrenaline, so elated to finally

Then there is the car. Those of you with a good memory may remember my, "Which One?" article in the October 2009 issue of Provinz, where I expressed concern as to the merits of a Boxster as a track car. Boy was I wrong. My Boxster S was mind-blowing. Cue up all the corners like it's on rails, balanced handling tag lines, they're all true. The thing just goes where you point it, exactly where you point it. I did not scare myself once or ever feel like the car was







in danger of getting away from me. I'm not sure that I could say the same if my first track experience had been in some other Porsche without an engine in the middle. You know what I mean.

I mentioned getting gas. Oh, my God, the fuel consumption. You know intellectually that the car is going to burn a lot more gas with the pedal to the floor most of the time, but it still comes as a surprise. You can almost see the gas gauge plunging closer to "E" with each lap. I had to scurry to a gas station between on-track sessions both Saturday and Sunday to top up. If it's your first time

at the track, make sure you have as close as possible to a full tank when you arrive.

Sunday was when the real learning began. I had a good night's sleep at a B&B, ten minutes away, and after an incident free first day was beginning to realize that I could actually do this. Whereas Phil had been something of a passenger for part of Saturday, by Sunday morning we were a team. I could focus on what Phil was saying and notice the improvement when I heeded his suggestions. As we pulled into the pits after each session, I was drenched in sweat from concentrating and focusing so hard for twenty minutes. Saturday felt like survival. Sunday felt like school. I guess that's why they call it driver's education.

I drove home, top down across the 407 in convoy with two 80's 911s that had also stayed on at Mosport right to the end of day. We cruised at 120 in the slow lane while the usual flotsam of minivans and SUVs passed us by, hurriedly on their way. Having spent the weekend at the track, we didn't feel the need to go any faster. Once the Porsche was tucked away in the garage, I proceeded to register for all of this year's DE's that do not conflict with a family obligation or a vacation. I really don't think that it is possible to do this only once.

or a Porsche lover, this event is a must to attend! The Central PA Region of the Porsche Club of America brings its world-famous Porsche-Only Swap Meet to Hershey, Pennsylvania, every April. For years, my wife Sheryl and I have wanted to attend this meet. I have seen it advertised in Panorama as being "without

exaggeration the largest event of its kind on the planet. It typically brings nearly 650 vendors, around 1,000 Porsches, and over 6,000 visitors together in Hershey every year". The timing was perfect, as we were planning on launching Sheryl's Auto-

motive Personal Art business, YourAutoMementos.com. So why not kill two birds with one stone and attend the event as a vendor. The preparation and planning process involved buying a Vendor tent, assembling the displays, packing the artwork and getting ourselves on the 800km drive to the show. All the stuff wouldn't fit into the Boxster S, but luckily the Odyssey had ample space.

We arrived Friday evening to make sure we would be ready at

We arrived Friday evening to make sure we would be ready at the gates when they opened Saturday morning at 6:30 am. It seemed much earlier than our DE days! The event was extremely well organized and, after going through at least 6 checkpoints, we found our booth location in the huge parking lot beside

Hershey stadium. They expect 1,000 Porsches to attend but if 2,000 showed up, there would still be lots of space for everyone.

As with any swap meet (or garage sale for that matter), there were many "early birds" dashing about to make sure they had the best selection. These folks are on a mission! By about 7:30 am the Porsches really started to roll in. They were from all over, many coming in

groups. The 968 and 914 guys all seem to travel together. We saw a few Ontario license plates, one or two Quebec plates but most were from the surrounding ten or so states. The Porsches keep rolling in until about 11 am when it seemed the maximum number had arrived; judging by the length of the line-ups for the washroom anyway. >





If you are looking for Porsche parts to buy or just ponder over, this is the place. I have been to lots of car swap meets before, but never one like this, where virtually every vendor has something for my car. It takes forever just to walk up one row, let alone all of them! I cannot remember seeing this many Porsche parts in one place ever. Given the longevity of our favourite marque, most of the parts were about 20 years old or older, but some stretched back to the very early cars. I was surprised to see so many 356 parts on display but, I guess, if you got 'em this is the place to sell 'em. Most of the parts were not of the pristine condition you see at California swap meets but, generally, Porsche parts (at least those made since the mid 70's) stand up well to the elements even in the



North-East. There was lots of sheet metal on display as well as wheels and tires. Lots of interior components from cars that became dedicated DE or racecars. Mechanical parts were not very plentiful, I guess because of their long service life. Prices in general were lower than I expected, especially for us Canadians, due to our dollar being at par. As with any swap meet, the prices started out high in the morning, but what remained a half hour before closing was available on a "make an offer" basis. When I bought my '08 987S, I sourced a spare tire, jack and

toolkit from a wrecker in Oaklahoma in "as new" condition for \$300 plus shipping. There was a vendor at this swap meet that had three spare tire sets for \$175 each, none sold by the end of the day. In fact, the general buzz among the vendors was that lots of people were looking but few were doing any real buying. Large established Porsche aftermarket parts dealers like Rennline seemed to be very busy. They were offering 25% off on all parts at the swap meet and with our dollar's strength and no shipping, the prices were a bargain.

I was expecting to see more cars in the Concours area, I estimate there were about 60-70 cars in total entered, but the quality of the cars made up for the quantity. They were gorgeous! Everything from some really early 356's to a brand new Panamera, which was guaranteed a third place as there were only three cars in its class. The Panamera's owner was taking some heat, as the car wasn't even properly cleaned for the event: too new to bother. I guess. The restored cars were gorgeous and

> meticulously prepared as always. Personally, I love to check out the survivors. The ones that have been lovingly cared for over the years and, although they have a light patina from very careful use, are carefully preserved and not restored because they are "only original once".

> A modern Carrera GT appeared, in all its glory, shortly after lunch, and was given a prime parking spot adjacent to the Concours cars. The owner put on a bit of a show for the 25 or so enthusiasts that flocked to the car by rewing that beautiful engine. What a sound! It's always great to see one of these magnificent cars. It had a permanent crowd of 10-15 people around it the entire time it was there.

> Did anything unusual happen at this event? You bet, I sighted a beautiful old Lamborghini Islero from the early 60's in the parking lot!

A great day and a great event; a dream event for every Porsche lover. Maybe you think an artist would feel out of place at an event like this, amidst the used parts etc. Not at all! Porsche people are great wherever they meet! We had lots of interest in Sheryl's truly unique Personal Art for Automotive enthusiasts; the only problem was keeping me in our booth! There was just too much to see! We look forward to meeting you at another PCA event soon. (**)

ore than a dozen UCR members, plus many Canadians from other regions, attended the world's largest Porsche gathering, the Porsche Parade, which was held in ST Charles, Illinois July 3rd — 9th. More than 700 cars were in attendance for a week of Concours, Rallies, Fun Runs, Autocross and many other activities. UCR was recognized by the PCA, achieving a trophy for website (second place) and newsletter (Provinz - third place).

Some extremely rare cars were shown this year, including a 1948 Gmund Coupe, the seventeenth car produced, and a 1952 Porsche America. The latter was a car that Porsche only built at the request of Max Hoffman, a highly influential US importer who also commissioned the Speedster and persuaded Daimler-Benz to build the Gullwing. Ferry Porsche was not an enthusiast and few were built. There were some magnificent early 356 models on display, including a 1952 Reutter Cabriolet. (Reutter Carosserie originally built a lot of the bodies for Porsche until production facilities were set up. After losing the contract they gradually diversified into production of sports seating, shortening their name from REutter CArOsserie..to Recaro.).

Pure competition cars included a 962, a gorgeous 904, the 911R Hybrid, and the Pikes Peak record-breaking car, fresh from its triumph. Just about every production model was on display, including some of the wonderful 2.7 RS Carreras. Among them was an RS Targa. There was no such car ever produced officially, but Porsche built this single example for Roger Penske. A single 550 Spyder was shown, beautifully minimalist and perfectly proportioned. An unrestored but perfectly functional Porsche Junior tractor attracted a lot of attention also.

The welcome reception was held at nearby DeKalb airport, where a number of vintage aircraft were on display, providing a perfect backdrop for a selection of the cars. The display was flown over by a T6 trainer and a P51 Mustang, both of WW2 vintage. This was one Mustang that was indisputably faster than any product from Zuffenhausen!

The week continued with very challenging but highly enjoyable TSD and Gimmick rallies, and many other activities. Next year will be in Savannah. Outside of the Porsche Museum, this is probably the best chance you can have of seeing the entire history of Porsche in one place, and to meet knowledgeable and friendly fellow enthusiasts.

Jeff Zwart Wins at Pikes Peak

olorado Springs - June 27, 2010 - Jeff Zwart, from Woody Creek, Colorado, driving the specially- prepared Luminox Watch Porsche 911 GT3 Cup race car, has won and set a new record in the 2WD Time Attack class in Sunday's 88th running of the Pikes Peak Hillclimb.

Zwart, now a seven-time Pikes Peak class winner, not only broke Rhys Millen's 2009 class record by 38 seconds (after smashing his qualifying record by 18 seconds), but went faster than all but five of the entire field - three Unlimited Class and two Open Wheels cars, all with 600-plus horsepower. His 911 GT3 Cup car also beat all the produc-

tion based racecar entries, 2WD and 4WD. Nobulhiro Tajima, from Japan, won the hillclimb overall in an eight-cylinder, turbocharged Suzuki 4WD one-off race car with an Unlimited Class entry.

Zwart said the key to his victory was the confidence that built up every time he drove the car. "In my previous six victories - all in Porsche street-based turbo

cars - I spent most of my practice time trying to tame the car to fit this difficult course. With this Porsche 911 Cup car, it was clear to me from the beginning that the car was challenging me to drive my best, and I went faster every time I stepped behind the wheel. Each time I thought I was asking too much from the car, especially when I carried maximum speed into one of those hairpins, the Porsche responded and challenged me to push even harder," said Zwart.

He also repeated his amazement from Friday's qualifying session that the normally-aspirated car didn't lose horsepower from its 9,000-foot-elevation start and the 14,000-foot finish line. A combination of the 450-hp, 3.8-liter Porsche Cup car engine and expert engine map adjustments from Porsche Motorsport North America gave Zwart the performance of a lifetime.

Zwart again praised the Pirelli road racing rain tires, which he felt held their grip evenly on both the gravel and tarmac surfaces, a necessity as the course has been transformed from all gravel to half and half. Next year, with two more miles of the 12-mile course scheduled for paving, road-racing-based tires will make more sense than ever. The team made some adjustments to tire pressures on all four wheels prior to qualifying. Pirelli had developed a tire for Zwart based on the rain tire they use for the Rolex Grand-Am series.

"Without Luminox Watches, Porsche Motorsport North America, and Pirelli Tires' support, this victory would not have been possible," said Zwart.

Porsche Motorsport started with a 2007 Cup car, updated it to 2010 specifications, and installed a new 450 horsepower 3.8-liter engine, currently in use in the Patron GT3 Challenge, American Le Mans Series Challenge Class, and the Porsche Supercup series. The engine management mapping was modified to perform well in high altitude, as the race starts at 9,390 feet and finishes at

the summit, 14,110 feet above sea level, and ride height was increased for the gravel sections of the course. The underbody was also modified to protect the car from gravel and stones similar to rally competition.

Zwart has now won his class at Pikes Peak - all in Porsches - in 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2002 and 2010, setting new class records four

times. Most recently, before this weekend, he co-drove a Porsche Cayenne with Pikes Peak veteran Paul Dallenbach at the challenging TransSyberia Rally (Moscow to Mongolia) in 2007. He also has an SCCA PRO Rally Championship (1990) and a SCORE Baja 1000 class win (2004) to his credit.

The Porsche 911 GT3 Cup car, built on the same assembly line in Stuttgart as the street-legal Porsche 911s, is raced all over the world in the Porsche Supercup series as well as various Porsche Carrera Cup and Challenge Cups, including IMSA Patron GT3 Challenge. New last year was the addition of the American Le Mans Series Challenge class, where the Porsche 911 GT3 Cup cars contest the full endurance series run by the Le Mans racers.





e are currently mid-way through the 2010 Autocross season; the second event ran on Father's Day, June 20th and was a great success. What better way to spend a Father's day than with your kids at an Autocross? My son kept me company and volunteered to record times for the participants.

The majority of the group was made up of first timers and we got great feedback, both at the event and afterward, as several participants took the time to write me an email. It's rewarding to know that the participants had a great time and I appreciate the feedback. Please feel free to email me with questions or comments anytime.

Many people ask if it is okay to bring kids to this event. It is definitely okay; in fact, one or both of my kids have attended almost every autocross event that the PCA has put on. Soon my daughter will be a participant. The Porsche Club is and always has been about the people, and we have strived to make the autocross events something that you can enjoy with your family.

If you do decide to bring your kids, regulations require that waivers be signed. There are two forms: 1) "Release and Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement for Minors as Observers ONLY" and 2) "Release and Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement for Minors in Restricted Areas, Driving or Riding". A minor is anyone under 18 years of age. Only one of the two forms must be completed. Form (1) must be signed by on parent or guardian, while form (2) must be signed by both. In autocross, the area where the cars run is considered "restricted" so we recommend getting form (2) completed. You only need to do this one if at the start of the season you fill in the "location" question with "ALL PCA EVENTS" and the "dates" question with "ALL DATES". Once done, you supply the original at the first event and you only need to supply a copy each subsequent event. Both forms are available on the Autocross page at our award winning website. The link is located on the left panel just above the dates. Just click on the link called "Downloadable Insurance Forms and Instructions".

We also allow non-Porsches to participate in the autocross. This means if your Porsche is not available, or even if you just choose to drive your other car, you are welcome to bring it to this event. If your kids drive and are not minors, they can bring their own cars and participate themselves.

The autocross focuses on improving driving skills, rather than on competition. I found this approach encourages discussion between drivers and increasing the fun factor. The remaining dates for this year are: September 19 and October 10.

A typical autocross day starts at 9:30am. The course will already be laid out and the timing system tested. Between 9:30 and 10am we get the drivers registered and get all the necessary paper work done. At 10am we have a driver's meeting, which includes walking the course. Once we complete the track walk and answer any and all questions, the first car lines up to the start gate for the first of a minimum of 6 runs. We are normally done by 3pm, sometimes earlier if everyone decides to skip the lunch break.

The location continues to be the Toronto Star facility in Woodbridge, but we are scouting out other venues. Please email me directly if you have any suggestions for new venues. As always, check the UCR web site for up-to-date details on dates, locations and registration information. I would also like to extend an invitation to anyone interested in taking photos of the event. I'm looking to update my photo collection and the photos on the web! (\mathbf{x})






