

#### 25 Years Ago



#### **UCR Tech Session**

### Porsche Cayenne S Hybrid

### Orange Your Colour?

afety Orange, sometimes known as vivid orange, is now a common colour on all Hybrid Cayennes. Porsche Exclusive would most likely be very pleased if you ordered your entire vehicle to be painted this highly visible colour, but what we are referring to is the colour of the high voltage (HV) cables running from the electric motor ("E-motor") in the en-




gine bay to the HV battery under the cargo floor in the rear of the vehicle. Perhaps these cables are the most distinctive visual element when the engine cover is opened on a new Hybrid Cayenne.

Three thick copper wires, each about the diameter of a garden hose, transfer electricity between the E-motor, the rear-mounted Battery Management System (BMS) and the 288 Volt nickel-metal hydride (NIMH) battery. Since this voltage is considerably above the common 12 Volts found in automobiles, and even above our 120/240 Volt household circuits, extreme caution is required when working on these vehicles. Only certified Porsche hybrid technicians should perform maintenance, since the vehicle is considered "live" at all times, even when the engine is shut off, unless the HV switch is disengaged in a specific sequence.




Safety Orange is an appropriate colour used to warn us to NEVER TOUCH the wires or the connected components in the vehicle. Even when in the shop for service, technicians affix special exterior labels to the vehicle to identify the status of the HV system, and only the technician who disengaged the HV switch is authorized to rearm the system.






Just like utility electrical line workers who perform maintenance on the grid running through the countryside and through our towns and cities, specific procedures are to be followed when working around the HV components on hybrid vehicles. Several new components in the Hybrid Cayenne provide control over the added electrical and mechanical systems used to transform a gasoline-powered vehicle into a combined gaselectric vehicle. These components add 390 lbs to the overall weight of the vehicle, compared to the standard Cayenne S, consisting of an electric motor and separating clutch weighing about 130 lbs, the HV battery weighing about 178 lbs, a battery ventilation system to keep the battery cool in hot weather and warm in cold weather, power electronics required to operate and control the systems, and the HV cables. The primary power source is a 3.0L V6 direct fuel injected (DFI) engine with supercharger, producing 333 HP between 5,500 and 6,500 RPM. The E-motor adds an additional 46 HP, for a combined total of about 380 HP, only 20 HP shy of the standard gasoline-engine Cayenne S. Since the hybrid engine will start and stop as directed by the on-board power electronics, an electric vacuum pump is needed to provide consistent brake force boosting. Similarly, an electric air conditioning compressor is added to provide interior climate control, and an electric servo pump is added to provide steering assistance.

The E-motor consists of a separating clutch to allow engagement or freewheeling ("sailing") of the gasoline-engine, motor and transmission, and a specific housing for the motor to produce drive and energy generation. The E-motor can generate electricity when asked, provide a boost to the gasoline-engine when needed, act alone to drive the vehicle up to about 37 mph, or can be disengaged waiting for the next command from the on-board power electronics. The transmission is an 8-speed Tiptronic S, which is somewhat unusual for a hybrid since some other less performance-oriented manufacturers have opted to go with continuously variable units. Since





Porsches are driver's cars first and foremost, the engineers deemed the 8-speed to be the best transmission for this application.

The HV cables are shielded lines with reinforced insulation. On the Hybrid Cayenne these cables are made of copper just like typical household wiring, but are wrapped in a shield with two layers of insulation. Cables located at points within the vehicle susceptible to possible damage during a crash are protected by additional aramid fibre hoses made of Kevlar. All HV connections in the vehicle are shock-protected and designed to prevent incorrect connection via mechanical coding of each connector end, so called poka-yoke assembly, to ensure the proper connection is made every time.

So, feel free to order your Hybrid Cayenne in Safety Orange, but rest assured the engineers and technicians at Porsche have thoroughly thought through the details to make the hybrid drive components not only safe, but also very efficient and performance oriented. Without the proper training, you should never attempt to service a Hybrid Cayenne yourself. Leave driving the vehicle to be your sole dose of electrification.

Spyder Spyder

Wherein our author informs us what UCR Autocross events are all about, while at the same time singing the praises of the Porsche Boxster Spyder, which of course is a descendent of the famed Porsche 550 Spyder.

othing connects you and your Porsche more quickly or cost-effectively than running in Mario Marrello's autocrossevents. Or more lawfully, for that matter, if you've noticed thepolice car lurking in the background of the opening photo, which just happens to be your reporter pulling into the finish box in the Porsche Boxster Spyder.

We competitors wondered too, after the officer showed up at our final event of 2010, parked, observed, seemingly took notes. And then he handed over a list of the speeds he'd clocked us at with his radar gun... and left. He'd just been taking a break from serving and protecting.

More about the Boxster Spyder later, but first, a few introductory points about the sport itself. 'Competing in autocross events,' is what I first wrote in my lead paragraph - but running is the more apt word because the sole competition is with yourself, rather than other drivers.

Consider coming out and giving it a try: spring autocrosses are scheduled for April 17 and May 29.

Each of six or more runs through the course of pylons is timed. It's a certainty you'll improve with practice. How many seconds better with each run, is the addictive question.

The cost: Thirty Dollars.

**The place:** The parking lot at The Toronto Star printing plant, Highway 400 and Highway Seven. (Refer to the UCR website for details.)

The interruption in your very busy life: minimal. You arrive by 9:30 a.m. and leave around 2 p.m. Little preparation is necessary beyond torquing your wheel nuts and maybe prettying up the Porsche. Just about the only requirement is filing your entry by midnight the Thursday before the event. There is no scrutineering. No helmet is necessary.



First, Mario walks us through the course of pylons he's laid out. Now that he's UCR president, he eventually may need to designate someone to take over the autocross program, but I hope not. His relaxed approach has a lot to do with the event being pressure-free and pleasurable.

If you're as easily confused as this writer, the pylons may, initially, appear as some sort of a labyrinth. Fine, Mario will navigate from your passenger seat until you find your way.

My first autocross was last year's season-opener. The major achievement that day, quite frankly, was learning that I was capable of following the course start to finish without straying. It seemed no sure thing to begin with. But the second success was realizing that my 911 SC was capable of delivering faster and faster times as I improved.

How I came to be driving a Boxster Spyder last October is explained by the fact I make a living writing about cars. It was a test car, mine for a week. What I quickly learned was, this is a hardcore Porsche intended for sport – not a good choice for comfort seekers, as Toronto-caliber pot holes can jar your glasses clear off your nose.

The Inspiration: One moment I was reflecting on how the Spyder would be the perfect choice for those Porschephiles into tracking or autocross - and the next thought was that Mario's season-closing autocross was scheduled for that very Sunday. Entry filed, ASAP.

It was wonderful. The very firm suspension that hurt on the street helped limit lean and weight transfer through the pylons. Any Boxster's steering and balance is superb, but the Spyder delivered another dimension of responsiveness.

Not to dwell too much on results, but I was delighted to find the Boxster Spyder recorded the third fastest time that Sunday. In my own 911 SC (known as the Cashmere Cliff from my chronicling its restoration in Excellence: The Magazine About Porsche), I'm more likely third slowest. Results are not normally posted, it's important to note, so newcomers needn't be concerned how they stand. Just this once Mario revealed the complete list of times to indicate the Boxster Spyder's performance.

For the record, newer 911's were fastest that Sunday with a 997 setting the pace and a 964 RS America second. The Boxster Spyder had the stuff to be fastest, I was left thinking, but the guy in the driver's seat didn't, not this day. If I'd slowed down slightly in the curves between the slalom sections, settling the car rather than being out of shape entering the final line of pylons, who knows? Always an 'if.'

Ron Woodward ran in the Datsun 260Z he bought while in high school. The Fisher family are regulars with their Volkswagen GTI and 1978 Mini, along with the 1968 Porsche 912 (with its two-litre "outlaw" six cylinder).

But mostly it's Porsches. All kinds. It's as though that preamble at the beginning of the Porsche driver's manual I've saved from my first 356, quoting word for word, "Judging you by the car you own, you rank high among discriminating motorists. You are probably no freshman when it comes to automobiles," continues with a command, "Now do the right thing, and take it to an autocross."



#### **Porsche Boxster Spyder**

Weighing just 1,275 kg or 2,811 lb, the Boxster Spyder is the lightest model throughout the entire range of Porsche cars. Clearly recognisable right from the start, this new mid-engined roadster represents the true, purist form of the Porsche sports car — light, powerful, consistently open, and very efficient.

This is precisely the formula already applied in creating Porsche's most successful road-going sports and racing cars, ranging from the legendary 550 Spyder all the way to the RS Spyder so successful in motorsport today.

The Boxster Spyder now continues this clear-cut philosophy with an exceptional power-to-weight ratio, thus reflecting a common wish expressed by Porsche customers. The new model entered the market in February 2010 as the third version in the Boxster range, joining the Boxster and Boxster S.

Equipped with Porsche-Doppelkupplungsgetriebe (PDK) and the Sports Chrono Package, the new Spyder, using Launch Control, accelerates from a standstill to 100 km/h in 4.8 seconds. Again with optional PDK, fuel consumption is a mere 9.3 litres on 100 kilometres (equal to 30.4 mpg imp) in the New European Driving Cycle, (NEDC). Top speed is 267 km/h or 166 mph – with the roof open.


The Pfaff booth was yet again a favourite for visitors to the show. Located in the Concorso Exotica and flanked by several premium brands creating a high traffic area.

The vehicle featured a Techart body package, including Techart Formula 3 19-inch alloy wheels and Pfaff custom paintwork on the hood, roof, wheels and trim, making it a one-of-a-kind Porsche 911 and one of the most impressive vehicles of the Pfaff collection.

New to this year's display were the Pfaff Motorsports 2011 race cars, which are gearing up for a full race season starting in May, with the 2011 Castrol Canadian Touring Car Championship. The Audi A5 will be driven by Jeff Pabst in the super touring car series and the VW GTI will return with P.J. Groenke for its second consecutive year in the touring car series — both are expected to be strong contenders in this year's race to the podium.

The 2011 Canadian International AutoShow in Toronto has come to an end with record attendance levels as compared with previous years. The upswing in the Canadian economy has no doubt played a factor, both in drawing larger crowds and in encouraging automotive exhibitors to take their displays to a new level. Hopefully at next year's AutoShow we will see an even larger booth, with a wider assortment of vehicles from Pfaff, given the excitement and the buzz generated by this year's display.

The Concours can be as simple or as complicated as you like, from a nice display of Porsches to enjoy on a beautiful summer day, to the last details of restoration perfection, and anywhere in between. The Parade Concours is the premier Concours event of the year for PCA; a truly awesome display of over 60 years of Porsche history in America and beyond. The Parade location this year is Savannah, Georgia, a charming destination city that is sure to provide you with your fill of pralines and peanuts once you have had enough of the Concours.

For the first time in the Park's history, an automotive display will be allowed on these grounds, courtesy of the 2011 Parade Concours. Porsche Club of America members will stroll the lawns and gardens, festooned with possibly the finest display of Porsches in Parade history. Reds, Blues, Yellows and Blacks will add to the Green of Forsyth Park, as Porsches in all shapes and sizes converge on the grounds. The Monday event is open to the public and will be buzzing with activity all day long.

Featuring over a hundred cars, the Concours will display competitive vehicles in classes, divisions and groups in four major areas: Preparation, Preservation, Restoration and Performance. The crowd favorite Historic Display should feel right at home in this location as well! And if competition is not your thing, the Corral is another possibility. Several hundred Porsches will be displayed (grouped by model) in the non-competitive Corral. To join this collection of Porsches, you just need to submit a regular entry to the Parade before registration closes... but if you can't bring your Porsche and want to view the Concours, just bring yourself, as this event is open to the public.

The four groups of cars are grouped in roughly the following criteria (memorize this to impress any innocent bystander at Forsyth Park that asks the "What's this Concours thing all about..." question!):

**Preparation** - This is the group comprised of mostly newer cars, they are being judged on how well prepared they are (i.e.: clean). There is not so much emphasis on originality as how completely free of dirt the car is, so watch out for those Q-tips!

**Preservation** - This group is the opposite of Preparation, it is reserved for cars that have been faithfully maintained and kept original over many years, so you will see mostly older Porsches here with decades of careful care and attention. Cleanliness is not so important, but all of the original bits and pieces certainly are!

**Restoration** - This group is made up of cars that have been restored to their original condition. This time-consuming process is evaluated by experienced teams of judges, some of whom actually remember what these cars looked like when they were new! Cleanliness and originality are judged, making this group a difficult proposition for entrants, so thankfully, there are cars judged in Touring (top only) and Full (top and bottom of the car is judged).

**Performance** - This group of cars ranges from all-out racers to modified street cars, most of them "personalized" to their owner's liking. You will see a lot of variety in this group, which is judged on cleanliness only and features highly modified and performance-oriented Porsches.

I hope that this little refresher course on the Parade Competition Rules helps you spot the different groups at the Concours and make more sense of the myriad of awards and trophies at the banquet. You can also browse the Porsche Corral and Historic Display for cars that are not competing, but certainly add a lot to the display. Feel free to come a day or so early and enjoy the prep area (air-conditioned!) in the convention center and see all the work that goes on behind the scenes of our Day at the Concours!

ur Driver Education season officially begins this month with two of our Introductory Driving Schools. These schools, held at the Mosport Driver Development Facility, are a prerequisite to our Driver Education Program. They teach basic car control, accident avoidance, and proper cornering technique, so you don't scare the crap out of your instructor. It's also the foundation of good driving, so even if you don't continue into the next program, you will be a better, safer driver. This is a fun way to spend the day getting to know your Porsche and comes with a great lunch.

It's also time to pull the Porsche out of storage (if you're not a winter driver) and prepare the car for all the summer fun that's coming your way. Don't put off repairs until they ruin a Fun Run, Autocross, Social or DE. Do your yearly maintenance now and you can enjoy a season filled with fun and friends with dependable equipment. I managed to turn a leg and ankle into mush this winter, so I didn't get anything done on my car. I hope, as you read this, I'm finally walking on the dang thing. You would think that you could grow another one in three months but stem cell research is moving too slowly to help me... lol.

While I can't help your driving at the moment, I can give you great advice if you break your leg and crush your ankle. 1) Never go into a corner on crutches. It's almost impossible to turn around and you'll be laughing so hard you might fall down again. 2) Make sure you preheat the shower, not just heat up the tub. If you hit the little button, you won't be able to get out of the way of the arctic blast. 3) When you're finally brave enough

to drive your automatic to the drive-through at Tim Horton's, make sure someone changes the batteries in your garage door opener. Otherwise, you'll find yourself looking at a closed door in a snow storm, knowing your coat is in there somewhere. 4) Don't hop anywhere. It might seem like a good idea to hop over to the coffee table instead of using the crutches, but with an ankle injury the first hop will make you feel like the cast is ripping your foot off. Then you have to hop back. 5) When someone knocks on the door, ignore them. They won't be there by the time you get there. If they didn't know you were hurt and didn't call ahead, then they weren't your friends or family anyway. Finally, it's much wiser to be careful and not fall off things in the first place. I hope that helps.

Some news for our Driver Education participants! Our friends at Braidan Tire are setting up a shop at Mosport this year. Not only will they provide full tire services for all of our events but they have some of the most modern equipment available, for even the most expensive rims. They are also going to provide a storage program so you could leave your track tires there and have them mounted when you return for your next event.

With Michelin's sponsorship, Braidan is also extending an invitation to all of our signed-off drivers to attend their charity event. This Advanced Solo Lapping day will be held on July 18th, in conjunction with our NNJR event. That's a fourth day of track, with no student assignments, no work duties and only three run groups, for lots of track time. This additional day only costs a \$75.00 donation to "Wheels for Humanity" and is organized by your UCR Track Team, so it comes with all of our safety requirements in effect. This event has been added to our Track Schedule, which is accessible through the UCR website at www.pcaucr.org, so sign up now.

If that's not enough Advanced Solo Lapping you can also sign up for the three days of the UCR Club Race. Registration is also open for this July 29th, 30th & 31st event. Come out, drive the non-race portion and you'll get to see how the big boys & girls do it. Last year the racing was a thrill to watch. Mike Edmonds has taken over as Club Race Chair this year and with Wayne's help, he'll put on a fantastic event. Since you're going to be there anyway, why not volunteer to help them? Be a part of our Club Race at our home track. What could be better?

If you're already signed up for the May Driver Education event, don't forget to check the expiry dates on your Helmets and Harnesses. Your helmet must be a Snell rated helmet with a date code of either 2005 or 2010 and your harnesses can't be older than 5 years. They will be inspected at the first couple of events so don't get turned away. These equipment requirements are set by PCA and our Insurers for our own safety. They are minimum standards that must be met. Just an additional note about our Munchie Buffet Social at the May event: At the end of the day on Saturday, we all get together at the Restaurant to sample some of Janet's munchies, enjoy a free beverage and catch up with all of our friends. That means you too, so come out and enjoy our hospitality.

In other safety related news, we would like to welcome E-1 Medical as our Ambulance and Primary Care Paramedics for our events this year. E-1 Medical's staff are all Ministry Certified Paramedics and they spend the winters traveling to all the major U.S. races like the Daytona 24 and Sebring. Their expertise is in moving vehicle events, so they will be a great addition to our program. Of course, we won't need them because I'm going to stop falling down, but it's good to know that they're there.

Our June Track Walk event is going to be amazing this year. We start our Friday with Instructor Day at the Driver Development Facility. There our future Instructors from the Black run group will be introduced to the National Instructor Program and put through their paces. The Red run group will be working on our own skills while mentoring the new recruits. Saturday is a full Driver Education event ending with a 2 ½ mile Track Walk with Stephen Goodbody, our Chief Instructor. ### We need your help to run the 2011 Porsche Clash Club Race at Watkins Glen May 27 to 29 (Memorial Day weekend again)

he Clash brings lots of people to one of the best tracks in our region! This is a chance to see a lot of your friends and to make new ones. We need you and your friends as volunteers. It is the volunteers who make this a great event! We ask that volunteers help a full morning or afternoon. What do you, your friends, loved ones, any one you could bring with you, get?

Every volunteer will get a Something - likely a Jacket Work two times - Dinner the nights you work (Thursday, Friday and Saturday)

Work three times or all day Sunday - A \$100 Zone one Gift Certificate (handed out every evening)

Work on Sunday - Something like a Mug or Cap

Remember it's not the cars: it's the people that make PCA! Listed below are the areas and descriptions of where we need YOU!

Registration: This happens at the Registration building, on the northwest corner of Watkins Glen, outside of the track. Everyone must stop here and get a wristband to get into the track. Registration involves ensuring everyone, signs the waiver. This is a very busy place Thursday afternoon and Friday morning.

Garage Admin: This is the Administration of the race. Driver registration, hot pit passes, pullovers, copies, radios, race results from tower are faxed here for copying and distribution. Volunteer assignments and paperwork is also handled here and every volunteer must sign in every day here!

**Tech Inspection:** The job here involves working with the National PCA Technical Scrutineers. Cars are weighed, checked over for modifications, or problems. This is done in the first bays of the garage.

Timing & Scoring: Although the race is timed and scored with computers and in-car radio transponders, a paper trail is needed too. Volunteers here write down the car numbers as they pass the start/finish line. This is done from the top of the tower where you can see most of the track and you are inside.

Grid: All the cars are "parked" along the grid prior to the start. This year, like last, the grid is behind the garage, over by the turn 10 & 11 straight. The person at the start of the grid tells the drivers their grid number. People along the way direct drivers into their grid slot or point them farther down the grid. This job starts BEFORE the race; you need to be at the grid at least 15 minutes before the start of racing! This position is LOUD and you also need to be alert for moving cars.

**Enduro pits Monitor:** The job here involves working for the National PCA Scrutineers to ensure safety in the pits during the enduro. The National Scrutineers will hold a meeting and review what they want this group to do. This group only works on Sunday.

Every one needs to be sure they visit the Garage to ensure the paper work is done, and that their name is on the list of people that Volunteered.


