20 Years Ago





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Get To Know Your Porsche, Technically

suppose there are many ways to get to better know the technical components and systems in your Porsche. You can spend lots of time driving the car and observing in detail how the various systems work. You can spend time reading the owner's manual. You can research on-line, interesting stories and videos about your car. You can borrow or buy books on Porsches. You can talk to the knowledgeable folks at your favourite service centre. You can spend time learning on your own by working on your car, attending what some people may call the "School of Hard Knocks", as you will most likely make mistakes along the way, sometime costly, if you are like many of us. Or, you can attend the Centennial College Know Your Porsche - The Basics Course. I choose the latter, since my 996 recently came off warranty and I wanted to better understand what I may be able to work on myself and what is better left to the pros at my service shop. I also saw this as a great opportunity to do some hands-on work while under the supervision of pros, who have worked on Porsches for years. At only \$195 for the 18 hour course, I felt if I did just one repair to my car, like change the oil, I would pay for the course with everything else learned being a bonus. So off to the Centennial College website I went and signed up.

Now I have enjoyed working on many of my vehicles over the





years, and I have learned not to start a repair unless I first understand the entire procedure, as I could be setting myself up for additional expense to have someone else complete the job, should I run out of time or the capability. Having owned new cars, which were always serviced at their respective dealers for many of the most recent years, I saw this course as an opportunity to get my hands dirty again, which I quite enjoy, and perform an oil change, replace my tires and maybe even install new mufflers on my 996, since the left muffler has had a small buzz which has been bothering me for about two years. But first, I needed to educate myself about the basic technical systems on the car. Like anything, when you want to learn something right, take a course.

Over the years, I have heard great things about the Centennial College course and, now that I am based in Toronto and do not travel as often, I knew I could attend all six sessions, held Wednesday evenings from 7 to 10 pm starting April 7th, 2011. So I signed up. The course is offered typically twice a year, once in the spring and once in the fall. Centennial has a great facility located near Warden and Eglinton Avenues, known as their Ashtonbee Campus, which has several hoists and all the tools needed. All you have to bring is your car, any parts or fluids you wish to install, and a willingness to learn. Two fantastic instructors, Ben Ciantar and Tom Brown, who are both Centennial auto tech Professors, lead the classes. In attendance were about 20 students, each as unique and interesting as the various Porsches they drive. They brought a few 944s, a nice white 928S (I am biased in favour of the 928 since I also own one), various 996s in coupe, cabrio and 4S configurations, as well as 987 and 993 cars. Just looking at the myriad years and models of Porsches that show up is interesting and educational, and it is always nice to meet more great people. What was missing were the newer cars, like the 997, Cayenne, Cayman and Panamera models. But even if your car is still under warranty and you do not plan on working on the vehicle yourself, you can still learn lots about your vehicle and the other cars there, which can help make

Pro Tech Tips

- 1) Knowledge is power you may never choose to do the work yourself, but you will be much more informed when speaking with the Porsche mechanics who will work on your car.
- 2) After knowledge, having the right attitude, and time, is key to working on your car. Do not rush the work - allow yourself enough time to do it right, and have a backup car ready in case you do not complete the work or in case you need to run to get parts and supplies. Okay, you may need to ask your spouse to borrow his/her car so always stay on good terms!
- 3 Get the right tools. This does not mean you need to flag down the Snap On Truck, but know ahead of time what you will need and arrange to get decent quality tools to do the job. The job will go much easier if you do; trust me on this one.

you a more informed consumer when it is time to take your car to a service facility.

To help you decide whether or not this course is for you, I have designed the following four question survey. Please answer each question with either a "Yes" or "No": Has your Porsche's warranty expired? Are you interested in understanding more about the technical elements of your car? Would you enjoy the satisfaction of performing some maintenance items on your car, yourself? Do you enjoy time away from your spouse? :) If you answered "Yes" to at least two of the above questions, then you most likely would enjoy the course.

Although the course is structured to cover new material each week, the instructors are flexible and allow topics to be moved



from week to week, based on the interest of the students and their desires to perform various repairs to their vehicles. For example, I changed the oil and filter in my 996 one evening, and Ben took the opportunity to thoroughly explain how to tell if the car may have any mechanical issues inside the engine by taking apart the oil filter and inspecting for any metal shavings or signs of potential engine damage. Thankfully, my car passed the inspection! In another class, one student replaced the switch inside the driver's door which automatically lowers and raises the window when the door is opened and closed to ensure a proper seal, and Tom took the opportunity to explain how to properly remove the side air bag and interior trim, as part of the process. During another class, a Boxster was used to demonstrate how to properly and safely lift the car using a floor jack to change a tire. The desire of the instructors to al-



low the students to accomplish repairs they want to within the course content was a bonus, and is one of the reasons I highly recommend attending. Course topics included: vehicle jacking procedures; wheel changing; general vehicle inspection; oil and filters and other fluids; tire changing and balancing; brake systems; wheel alignment and various other related topics as they came up, based on the interest of the students.

Watch Provinz for an advertisement for the next course. Your time, and relatively small course fee, will be well spent. Since completing the course, I had the tires replaced on my car, and in my driveway, I installed new Fabspeed mufflers myself. Not only does the car now perform and sound better, there is a certain satisfaction that comes from doing some of the simpler repairs oneself. If you want to better understand your Porsche, this is a must take course.




Nominating Committee for the 2012 UCR Executive



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









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othing puts the brakes on an open air car show like foul weather; having just come through the wettest May in history there was obviously some concern. With three days to go, the forecast called for a three-day gap in the rain with sunny skies and our event was scheduled to fall right in the middle of the reprieve.

Bloor Street was closed to traffic the night before, at 7pm and crews started dropping off equipment and setting up, moving east to west from Yonge Street to Avenue Road. Seventy-five metre stretches of metal barricades would protect five corrals of cars, Porsche, Ferrari, Aston Martin, Jaguar and Open Class.

My nephew and I walked off each section

to make sure they were set-up to plan as dozens of workers laid 830 meters of red carpet, twenty feet wide, right down the middle of Toronto's newly renovated Bloor Street. The past two years of street work has resulted in wider, pedestrian—friendly granite sidewalks and curbs, over 130 new London Plane trees, new up-lighting and granite flowerbeds. Set against storefronts bearing the names of Prada, Gucci, Hermès, Harry Rosen and Royale de Versailles — this was the perfect venue for a car show. Fittingly, Rodeo Drive in Beverley Hills was holding their event on the same day in LA.

Sunday morning the staging crew showed up bright and early and pre-staging was well under way. Staging kits were distributed with two radios set to different channels for each crew, along with a copy of the final roster and the car ID plates. Everyone hit their assigned sectors and five teams set to staging over one hundred display vehicles in less than an hour.

Our car owners, sponsors and guests were treated to breakfast in the Paddock Club on the second floor of Yorkville's iconic Sassafraz restaurant and I introduced Academy Award winning writer and director, Paul Haggis, who spoke to the guests. Paul is originally from London, Ontario and in 2006 became the first screenwriter to write two Best Film Oscar winners back-to-back, Million Dollar Baby directed by Clint Eastwood and Crash, which he directed himself. Paul also founded Artists for Peace and Justice (APJNow.org) and he described the wonderful work his charity is presently doing in Haiti. Ev-

ery penny of every donation goes directly into building schools, medical clinics and providing food and clean drinking water to the children living in the poorest areas of that earthquake-ravaged country. He's giving those kids a fighting chance to recover from the devastation they have suffered over the past two years and we are proud to have his back in that fight.

With all the cars safely parked behind the stanchions and properly identified we were ready to roll. The 48th Highlanders Fife and Drum marching band led the first ribbon parade. Immediately following the band was Porsche Cars Canada president, Joe Lawrence in his 2011 Guards Red Porsche Carrera GTS Cabriolet. Joe





was accompanied by his three children, daughter Kate and sons, Drew and Rob. It was Father's Day after all, and what better way to celebrate than in a Porsche parade in front of 50,000 people.

One hundred and fifty feet of red ribbon stretched out between the lead Porsche and a 1964 Bali Blue Porsche 356 SC Cabriolet driven by UCR member Jerry Reckless. Twenty beautiful models supported the ribbon during the moving procession until it was in position for the first ribbon cutting ceremony in front of Harry Rosen. A paper-streamer cannon blast was the signal for several groups of dignitaries to cut the ribbon to officially open the Bay to Avenue section of Bloor Street.

The main concert stage had four big-name Canadian recording artists; Royal Wood, Keshia Chanté, Shawn Desman and Platinum Blonde entertaining the crowd throughout the day. There were dozens of smaller local acts as well, with street dancers, body painting, celebrity interviews and the all-too gorgeous finalists for the 2011 Miss Universe Canada contest. The atmosphere was charged with energy and the action was non-stop.

ince it's July and our track season is rolling right along, I thought I would mention a few things happening this month. The first is our joint event with our friends from NNJR. It's a three-day weekend filled with lots of track time, a Saturday evening dinner and a whole host of Instructors available for the lower run group drivers to take advantage of. This year we are following that with the Braidan Tire / Michelin Charity Event on Monday, so you can make a full four days out of it. The Charity Event requires a \$75 donation to Wheels for Humanity and is open to signed-off drivers only. Bring a check because we don't take Credit Cards for the Charity Event. That means no work assignments, no student assignments and plenty of track time with only three run groups. I'm tired just thinking about it!

July 29th weekend is the UCR hosted PCA Club Race. It's three days of amazing cars, amazing drivers and amazing action. Did I mention that it would be amazing? For us mere mortals the event offers Advanced Solo Lapping so you can drive your car between the practice, qualifying and racing. This event is only open to signed-off drivers and anyone in the White run group must have permission from our Chief Instructor, Stephen Goodbody, Since you're going to be there anyway, why not volunteer to help the Race Committee with some of their tasks. What a great (I almost said amazing) way to participate in your regional race.

This is Upper Canada Region's 35th Anniversary, so I hope everyone gets out and participates in a Porsche Club activity this summer. Whether it's a Fun Run, Golf Tournament, Social, Track Event, or just a barbeque with friends, your participation can have a big effect on your club and on the quality of your life.

One of the things that have a huge effect on everything we buy or sell is transportation cost. In the case of most "Trackies" fuel also has an effect on our playtime costs as well. With the rise in fuel prices this year there has been a demand that our government should do something about it. While artificially high prices threaten to stall the economy, the government has no interest in curbing these prices. With almost 30% of the pump price of gas as taxes, you could argue that the government is actually in business with the oil companies. Why would the government of the moment do anything to reduce their revenue? Our government sells all of our resources into the global market, so its citizens can buy them back at market prices. They have to protect their own four-year cycle and anything after that can be blamed on the new government.

An example of this short sightedness is the US Republicans holding the Obama government to the fire over their budget deficit. What they don't mention is that the deficit rose 62.9% during the Reagan, Bush / Republican years. It rose a full 20% in W's last term alone. How convenient to demand the debt be shouldered by the Democrats. Our current fuel problems are the same. I've heard excuses for the price increases for everything from the situation in Libya (4% of world production) to flooding in the Mississippi. As if flooding means anything to world oil production costs. Greed is the only explanation. It doesn't cost one dollar more per barrel to produce oil than it did six months ago. Oil companies can simply demand more for it to satisfy the speculators and their shareholders. Our only hope was a national oil company that produced enough fuel for our country from our own resources. Unfortunately, our government stole Petro Canada from us and sold it. If you think that it wouldn't have worked, here is a thought to ponder. In Venezuela the government supplies its own country before it sells the balance of its oil on the open market. Today the cost of gas in Caracas is 6 cents per litre, or less than a quarter per gallon.






