TECH SESSION



Boxer Engines

f you are a real fan of boxing, you most likely are aware of The Fight of the Century that was held on March 8, 1971 at Madison Square Garden in New York City, between what many believe to be two of the best boxers ever, Joe Fraser and Muhammed Ali.

Tickets were so hard to come by that even Frank Sinatra could not get one. Yet he apparently got in with the media by claiming to take pictures for Time Magazine. There are even pictures showing Sinatra holding a camera that evening, so it must be legit!

Fraser and Ali went the full fifteen rounds that night, with Fraser putting Ali down twice, and Ali quickly returning to his feet each time. Yet, Fraser ultimately won the match by leading in all three scorecards.

Through the eyes of this young boy it was a fascinating event as the relentless pounding, jab-cross-hook-cross, left-right-left-right, punches went back and forth for an hour, and for every punch delivered there seemed to be an equally responsive powerful response from the opponent. At times, punches were like explosions.

Not until I was recently thinking about 911 engines did I make the connection to that boxing match. So why do we call the engines in 911, Boxster (hint, hint) and Cayman sports cars, boxer engines, also known as flat or horizontally opposed? One just has to reflect on a match like the Fraser - Ali fight to seek the answer.

Boxer engines have all of their cylinders configured in a flat plane, with the pistons "punching" back and forth like the fists of boxers. Every thrust of a piston is matched with the opposite thrust from the piston located 180 degrees away on the other side of the crank.

In four-cylinder engines this analogy works well since each fighter obviously has two fists, totalling of course four—one for each cylinder. so to speak. In six cylinder engines (like in our current road-going Porsches) the analogy also works, but each fighter would have three fists, and so on for eight and twelve cylinder engines that are sometimes available in other vehicles.

Benefits of boxer engines include having a low centre of gravity since the pistons and surrounding cylinder cases are lying relatively low inside the engine bay almost in line with the drive shafts, and the engines are generally better balanced with shorter crankshaft lengths when compared to inline or V shaped engines.

Note the cutaway diagram included in this article showing the left bank of three, and the right bank of two of the three, opposed cylinders in a recent six cylinder 3.2L Boxster engine.

As well the cylinders were traditionally easier to separately air cool (bingo, pre-water cooled Porsche lovers) than engines which have their middle cylinders buried inside the crank/cylinder engine case like those of inline and V configurations. Of course today Porsche water cools these engines (as shown in the picture), but the ease of air cooling them in the past is a major reason why they initially gained such popularity.

In terms of limitations, boxer engines are typically wider than inline or V shaped engines and are more expensive to manufacture since there are at least two cylinder cases and added components for overhead cam configurations, when compared to inline engines.

At least two cams and associated valve train components are needed in boxer engines, one for each cylinder bank, versus just one for inline engines.

In rear-engined layouts, like 911s, the car body needs to be rather wide to cover the boxer engine as well as the suspen-

sion, exhaust, wheels and tires. To highlight this see the enclosed picture of a 1993 Porsche 911 Turbo showing on the left side the body and on the right side the underlying engine and components.

When a boxer engine is located at

the rear, it is clear the body of the car needs to be wide. In fact, I am sort of embarrassed to admit, that the nice rear end on a Cabrio I followed up a hill in the Presidio area of San Francisco a number of years ago was the tipping point in my reasoning for buying my next 911. For some

of us guys it just does not take much!

In mid-engined cars, say like a Cayman, the need for extra width is perhaps not as evident since the designers have massaged the bodies to hide this mid-width. But, if you look back at a Ferrari Testarossa from the 1980s, for example, with a flat 12 boxer engine, those cars were visibly wide.

Boxer engines located in the front are now rather rare, except for one manufacturer, Subaru, who has really devel-

oped their engines to the point they now "own" this

configuration.
Subarus are the only contemporary vehicle manufacturer offering a complete line of cars with front mounted boxer engines, often coupled with all wheel drive systems.

Typically boxer engines located in the front engine bay (due to their width) leave little room for steering components, but Subaru has designed their engines and drivetrains to make this layout feasible. In fact, it is a key feature in their marketing and they highlight

this layout to differentiate themselves.

Porsche is rumored to be working on a new boxer 4-cylinder engine expected to be launched in a vehicle occupying a price point below the Boxster. It is expected this engine will also be available turbocharged and appear in variants of the Boxster, Cayman and perhaps even the 911.

Remember the 912? It had a flat 4-cylinder engine, and was launched in 1965. Could we be headed for a better version of the '60s all over again?

Porsche is also rumored to be working a new boxer 8-cylinder engine to appear in their next supercar slotted to replace the 918. It is nice to know the limitations of engine design are nowhere near the end, and that boxer

engines should be around for a long time to come. Porsche, let's not let Subaru have this space entirely to themselves!

The next time you floor your Porsche sports car, think about Fraser and Ali going at it, toe-to-toe, for on hour, over fifteen rounds. We certainly want our Porsches to always go the distance too!





Ontario 1500 Motorsport Adventure

A new way to tour

ooking for a novel way to tour our beautiful province? Start planning now to enter the "Ontario ■ 1500" in September.

Like me, you may have enjoyed race tracks across Ontario and the eastern USA, from Sebring to Virginia International Raceway, Watkins Glen and Mid Ohio, to name a few. Each offers its own challenges with a great high performance driving experience.

This fall you could stay right at home and drive all of the road courses that Ontario has to offer, with a few twists along the way. In a format not entirely unlike the Targa Newfoundland, the "Ontario 1500 Motorsport Adventure" will see its inaugural year in 2015.

You haven't heard of it? Well to be honest neither had I until I bumped into Gary Wood at Watkins Glen last summer. As one of the event's organizers, he was there in part to give some publicity to the brand-new Ontario 1500 Motorsports Adventure to the just the sort of audience that should find it of interest.


The adventure will allow amateur teams of between two and four drivers to enter a car that will be driven across the province from one race track to another. At each track a different format of competition will take

Venues include our very own 'home track', CTMP/ Mosport, Calabogie, Shannonville, Toronto Motorsports Park and the Grand Bend Motorplex.

Calabogie Motorsport Park is a magnificent, relatively new and modern track cut out of the forest near Ottawa. Wide and safe, it rolls through hills and valleys to provide an exhilarating drive, and provides unique challenges including blind corners and the signature turn called "Temptation". Combined with lengthy straights and fast sweepers, driving here keeps a broad smile on your face all day.

Shannonville Motorsport Park started off as a motorcycle course and still holds numerous bike races. Over the years it has been lengthened and now offers a number of layouts, many of which incorporate a drag strip as the main straight. The high speed sweeping corners and esses keep your adrenalin flowing.

Toronto Motorsport Park in Cayuga is the home of the Canadian National Drag Race championships every year, and that overshadows a road course that is built on a former WWII airfield. The main features here are two straights connected with a high-speed 120-degree corner. Add in some esses and a hairpin and you have a track that offers fun in a tight setting.



Grand Bend Motorplex is the home of an annual IHRA drag race spectacular. Once again based on a WWII airfield the complex offers an oval track and road course. It is located in one of Ontario's popular beachfront destinations and this facility provides more miles of speed for your dollar than almost anywhere else.

The "Ontario 1500 Motorsport Adventure" is for street legal cars and will visit all of these motorsport venues for one week of competition from September 13, 2015 to Sept 20, 2015. It is your chance to drive every road course in Ontario and compete in 14 diverse timed stages, each using a different format.

Starting and finishing at CTMP, competing teams will tackle eight "Time Attack" stages, four "Solo II" autoslalom stages and two "Drag" stages, the results of which will determine the Champion. Time Attack drivers will need to be graduates of two accredited performance driving schools, and all drivers will need to be licensed in their home jurisdiction.

Transits will be supervised and driven during evening hours and drivers are required to observe all posted speed

Whether you want to go for the overall win or just experience the thrill of driving these tracks, this event sounds like Fun with a capital F. There are classes for every car but the field is limited to only 60.

Check out details and register at www.ontario1500.ca. I'm thinking a Caterham R500 might just do the trick, although if it rains the road driving will be miserable.







(which surprisingly they bought), and then from there we got on stage in front of all those people to sit in the GT3RS and GT4. I began to visibly drool and security dragged me off.


The crowds were enormous. I didn't get close enough to see the new Ferrari 488. The Aston Martin stand was jammed.





It is very difficult to put the throttle down if you're not confident and comfortable. The style that you adapt as your own will be all the things that made you feel safe and confident.

The big three-day June event is coming up quickly so if you're planning on participating now is definitely the time to enroll. This action packed weekend starts out with our biggest Charity Event of the year as we invite hundreds of Down Syndrome kids, along with their families and support workers, to CTMP for the day.
