

Pfaff Motors had the Adam's (his and hers) silver 944s tied and George Lagusis eked out a 356 win over **Bruce Farrow**. Event chair **Frank** Bittner took first place in 914 class.

25 Years Ago

The new 968 was featured on our cover. 29 new members joined, including Jack Webb. We reported that Membership Chairs Mark & Angie Herring had won the Zone Reps award at Parade in Danvers, MA - something rarely given. Dave Pateman was to host our 7th annual 914er day. Past President Crawford **Reid** was promoting board nominations. You have to picture this - Elizabeth Spivak wrote about going to Parade in Danvers, MA, in a 911, with four people (including two children), all their luggage, and a set of golf clubs.

20 Years Ago

Jack Christie wrote a feature about helping to develop a new Pirelli tire in France for the 944 Turbo Cup series. Franzl Chwoika was the race mechanic assisting. 



have had it since 1955 or 1956 (cannot accurately recall that far back). It was a birthday present, given to me by an uncle when we were living in Hungary. As the German advertisement describes, it cost 14.75 Deutschmarks (approximately \$3.50 USD) at the time. The original version operated on a single 4.5 volt battery, my updated model uses two D cells. It has a functional steering wheel, two forward gears, neutral and reverse and an ignition key. In addition, it has a mechanical remote control mechanism (as illustrated in the attached graphic) whereby







the red rubber cup attaches to the steering wheel, the metal armature with sprockets fits over the floor mounted gearshift, the alternate end of the flexible wire cable has two rubber cylindrical handles, twisting the red one turns the steering wheel, twisting the black one controls the gear shift.

So in fact I was driving Porsches in 1955 at the tender age of 7 – it got me hooked for life.

IMSA'S CANADIAN RACE

he International Motor Sports Association ("IMSA") has a 12-race schedule for the 2016 season of the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship. Canadian Tire Motorsport Park ("CTMP") hosted the only Canadian race on July 9th and 10th. It was also the venue for one of the six Porscheplatz that Porsche Cars North America ("PCNA") is organizing in

Porscheplatz is a car corral organized by IMSA and PCNA. The admission ticket price was \$115.00 and it included priority parking exclusively for Porsche cars; access to the Porsche hospitality tent overlooking the apex at Corner 1; raffle for IMSA hot pit experience; sign up for paddock tour with unrestricted views of the cars, garages, mechanics and drivers; a chance to drive your own Porsche at CTMP Grand Prix track in a parade lap on Sunday; Saturday lunch, and Sunday BBQ lunch plus draw prizes. There was also live closed circuit TV broadcasting of the races in the hospitality tent. The highlight of the Porscheplatz at CTMP was the "Meet 'n Greet" with two Porsche Cayman GT4 Teams - Bodymotion Racing and CJ Wilson Racing, and four Porsche Factory Drivers of Porsche 911 RSR cars #911 and #912.

The majority of the 100+ participants at the Porscheplatz were UCR members. We also had representatives from IMSA, Porsche Cars North America ("PCNA") and

Porsche Cars Canada ("PCC") such as Diezel Lodder (IMSA), Tiffany Lodder (IMSA), Paul Gregor (Manager, Porsche Clubs North America), Margareta Mahlstedt (Director of Marketing, PCC) and Kathrin Menge (Customer Relations Manager, PCC).

Lynn Friedman (PCA Zone 5 representative) led the Porscheplatz volunteer team which was comprised of the following UCR members: Mike Bryan (President), Terry Cassan, Randy Gananathan (Provinz Editor), Matthew Lam, Walter Murray (Past President), Gregory Sachs (Director), Ken Jensen (Past President and Webmaster), David Walker, John Van Atter (Past President), Pat Van Atter, Kathleen Wong (VP), Ted Youngs (2015 Enthusiast of the Year) and Foster Zanutto (UCR Secretary). Most of these volunteers worked at the registration desk inside the Porsche hospitality tent and directed traffic/ parking at the Porsche Corral. Manny Alban (PCA National Past President) was also present at the event.

The two major races of the weekend included: a twoand-a-half-hour Continental Tire SportsCar Challenge race; and a two-hour and 40-minute Mobil 1 Sportscar Grand Prix race.

The Continental Tire SportsCar Challenge took place on Saturday July 9th and it had a total of 33 entries with six entries in the Grand Sport Class and 27 entries in the Street Tuner Class:

1) Grand Sport (GS) allows American iron such as the Ford Shelby GT350R/C to battle with exotic international machines, such as the Porsche Cayman GT4 Clubsport, Porsche 911 and Aston Martin Vantage. GS cars are tuned to produce between 400 and 460 horsepower, featuring speeds in excess of 250 km/h; and

2) Street Tuner (ST) includes the Audi S3, Honda Civic Si, Porsche Cayman, BMW 328i and 228i, Mazda MX-5 and MINI John Cooper Works.

ST cars are limited to four-and six-cylinder engines and rotaries, producing between 230 and 290 horsepower. The top speed for this class is 216 km/h.

CJ Wilson Racing #33 Porsche Cayman GT4 Clubsport of Daniel Burkett and Marc Miller finished second in the GS Class and second overall at the Continental Tire SportsCar Challenge race on Saturday July 9th. The best lap time of #33 was 1.28.536. The Bodymotion Racing #12 Porsche Cayman GT4 Clubsport of Cameron Cassels and Trent Hindman finished fourth in the GS Class and fourth overall. The best lap time of #12 was 1.28.663. The sister car, #31 2012 Porsche Cayman that Jason Rabe and Devin Jones drove, finished ninth in the ST class and 13th overall.

The Mobil 1 Sportscar Grand Prix took place on Sunday July 10th and it had a total of 39 entries spread across four

classes: eight cars (P), seven cars (PC), nine cars (GTLM) and 15 cars (GTD).

- 1. Prototype (P) This class features the most technologically advanced sports cars in North America, which are capable of speeds approaching 320 km/h. The cars competing in this class are Corvette DP, DeltaWing DWC13-Elan, HPED ARX-03b, Ligier JS P2, Mazda Prototype
- **2. Prototype Challenge (PC)** This class features open top race cars and technology such as carbon fiber chassis, carbon brakes and a sequential gearbox. The cars competing in this class are ORECA FLM00-Chevrolet.
- **3. GT Le Mans (GTLM)** Utilizing the same technical regulations as the 24 Hours of Le Mans, the GTLM cars are the most elite and fastest GT cars on the track. The cars competing in this class are BMW M6, Corvette C7.R, Ferrari 488, Ford GT and Porsche 911 RSR. The #911 and #912 Porsche Factory Drivers of Porsche 911 RSR competed in this class.
- **4. GT Daytona (GTD)** This class utilizes the global FIA-GT3 Specification. The cars competing in this class are Aston Martin Vantage GT3, Audi R8 LMS GT3, BMW M6 GT3, Ferrari 458 Italia GT3, Lamborghini Huracan GT3, Porsche 911 GT3-R, SRT Viper GT3-R.





On Saturday July 23, 2016, the closest weekend date to our inauguration date, we celebrated our 40th anniversary with a family picnic at continued on page 24...









s a lover of fine automobiles, I appreciate the sound, style, and history of Porsche. In fact, my passion for the marque goes back to the early '50s, when, during the early days of racing at the Edenvale Aerodrome, north of Toronto, my Dad and I would watch and marvel at the profusion of Jags, Healeys and MG sports cars—but I soon realized nothing else stirred me quite like the progression of Porsches that so often headed the racing pack. Later, at the then-new Mosport Park, Porsche continued to provide stunning results, often against far bigger and more powerful opponents.

In my early teens, knowing our family would never own a Porsche, and never imagining I would ever own one, there seemed to be only one solution: I'd build a reasonable facsimile of one. Using winnings from a local Rotary bike riding and safety competition, and with help from my dad, I bought a \$45 air-cooled Briggs and Stratton motor and set to work. I persevered and in time, with four shiny new wheels on a bed-frame chassis and my engine in the rear (like my dream car) but no muffler, I donned my helmet and raced around a dirt track made with friends behind our Barrie home.

On bright sunny days, I'd venture onto a nearby deadend street and take friends for crazy rides in my 'pretend' black Porsche. For the special girls, I'd let them drive. What fun that was! I heard about an upcoming event for homemade karts, scheduled between the main stock car races at Pine Crest Speedway. A buddy and I went, with

no expectations of winning, just the thrill of competing. We had "Porsche-like" handling, but lacked power and speed. We came third in the field of five and felt like we'd won Daytona! And yes, there were some wonderful cars in the parking lots at those races—Porsche, though rare at the time, could always be seen and admired.

Time moved along and so did my sightings of Porsches at car shows, races, and rallies. I owned a variety of fun cars, though never a Porsche! My dream car briefly came into my life... my university buddy bought a magnificent used Porsche 356 convertible! Dave was generous but oh, how he







protected that sweet silver Speedster! I've often wondered whatever became of that car, which I'd once so admired.

Marriage, children, career, etc. did not set the stage for owning a Porsche but I read and collected many Porsche magazines articles, and scale models of Porsches adorned my library shelves. My dear wife became interested in Porsches through osmosis and our youngest son seems to have inherited the "Porsche gene"— like me, he loved to read about and study the endless Porsche progressions. Our family's visit to the Porsche museum in Germany was as anticipated as a trip to Disney World!

As my 70th birthday loomed, little did I know what was in store for me. My wife thought that if the money side of things could be arranged in secret from me, maybe, just

maybe, a Porsche could be in "our" future! She established some goals that only our eldest son knew about, and with his help, hoped to find an appropriate Porsche. He contacted an office colleague who regularly surfs the internet for antiques and who happens to be a car nut. In the following weeks, after locating a few in-budget candidates in the US, he found a stunning black 911 Targa locally. The owner had carefully maintained the car, and had always stored it in his garage.

The car was purchased in a secret arrangement between my wife, eldest son, and the owner. As one would expect, there were some trying moments and close calls in pulling this off right under my nose. My son's trips to the insurance

Well obviously I was wrong! The fact is, the Cayenne and Macan outsell all of the 2 door Porsches ensuring continued financial success of the brand.


The morning of the event, my wife Julia pushed aside any doubts I had that a 4 door Porsche would not be welcomed. She reminded me that the Porsche folks we





know that you will hear it from others but . . . elections are coming up in November and we will be determining who manages our club and its activities next year.



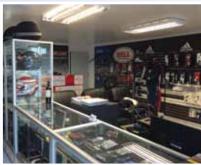
