

HOW TO JOIN UCR DE PROGRAMS AND PCA CLUB RACING The ins and outs of getting yourself on track By Kathleen Wong, UCR President

have met a number of Porsche owners who have come to club events as guests of our members. A popular question is how can they sign up for our Driver's Education ("DE") program and also get into PCA Club Racing.

Dave Osborne (DE Track Chair), Del Bruce (Worker Assignment) and Stephen Goodbody (Chief Instructor) have built a first-class DE program, and I have witnessed how the DE program has evolved over the past 19 years. Here are the details for anyone interested in participating in DE and PCA Club Racing.

- 1. Join Porsche Club of America (PCA) as a member. The annual membership fee is USD \$46.00 and you can attend all events across North America. Registration is online at https://www.pca.org/membership and anyone registering with an Ontario address will automatically be assigned to Upper Canada Region (UCR) or send Angie & Mark Herring (UCR Membership Chairs) an email at membership@pcaucr.org
- 2. After you have joined UCR, create an account at https://reg.pcaucr.org/ to set up your driver's profile and register for our track events. This is a must-do for PCA Insurance purposes.
- 3. The registration for our 2018 DE program goes live on January 1st, 2018 at 12.00am. Many UCR participants (I am one of them) register for DE events as soon as registration opens on January 1st for all DE sessions to ensure their spots. It is easy to cancel if unable to attend a registered session. The dates of our 2018 DE program are on P10 and posted on this link. http://pcaucr.org/driving/drivereducation/
- **4.** New UCR members, who are interested in DE, must complete the Introductory Driving School (IDS), a prerequisite to our DE program. UCR conducts two IDS in April

2018 and space is limited. If a new DE participant has prior training with other clubs equivalent to the UCR IDS and comes with track experience, they can seek approval from our Chief Instructor (P: 905-415-8248 or lsgform@idirect.com) to qualify to register for our DE program.

- 5. Our DE program is a two-day track weekend, every month from May to October. We have five colour-coded (green, yellow, white, black and red) run groups and every DE participant will be assigned a run group depending on your track experience. All new DE participants will be assigned DE instructors, who will ride with them and teach them advanced performance driving skills. As your skills progress over time, you will be promoted to higher run groups. Note that our DE events are non-timed events.
- 6. The highest run group is the red run group, which is the instructors group. The second highest run group is black run group. All DE participants in the black and red run groups can apply for a PCA Club Race Rookie License and then participate at PCA Club Race events across North America. For the new members who already have previous race experience, they can start in a higher run group after our Chief Instructor has verified your experience and you have been qualified in a Check Out Run. This will greatly reduce the amount of time required before a PCA Rookie License can be obtained.
- 7. For those who want to move on beyond PCA Club Racing, they can consider joining the Ultra 94 Porsche GT3 Cup Challenge Canada series. We have a number of UCR members who started with the DE program and moved onto PCA Club Racing, and eventually compete in the GT3 Cup Challenge Canada series: Tim Sanderson (our DE Co-Chief Instructor and UCR member since 1998), Marco Cirone, Orey Fidani and Shaun McKaigue.

Under his leadership, PARACHUTE is bound to play an ever larger role in making Canada a safer place to live.



Centrally located between Toronto and the Michigan border, Porsche of London serves a broad clientele across Ontario's southern corridor. Born of a partnership between the London-based Leavens group and Newmarket's Pfaff family, the dealership entered the scene in 2010 to cater to customers across southwestern Ontario. While it might seem like a small place on paper, the combined might of Leavens' local experience, Pfaff's extensive network and resources, and the team's passion and hard work have thrust Porsche of London beyond all

targets so far this year and set it on an upward trajectory into the years to come.

At the helm is General Manager Steve Rempel, a 12-year veteran of BMW and longtime Porsche enthusiast. For Steve, it all began with a phone call one evening after work. "Dad, I'm going to buy a 911" he said, before inviting him to come and share in the experience (and to exercise it when he was busy). His M Roadster had been a blast, he explained, but "[the 911] really is one of the most practical cars you can buy." Where the Z3 could

only fit a set of clubs in the passenger seat with the roof down, the 911 allowed him to load his three kids into the car and go out for ice cream.

When the opportunity arose for him to take a position working with Porsche, it was a no-brainer. More than just an opportunity within Leavens-Pfaff, Steve saw this as a chance to engage his automotive passion and to

grow with a smaller and more focused team. "Coming from BMW, maybe seven out of ten salespeople truly knew the product. Here, everybody knows (and loves) it inside and out. The detailed knowledge that some of these people bring to their work is truly incredible."

It's a statement that holds up whether you look to the sales floor or the wash bay. Venture on to the former and Tim Bamford will show you some of his proudest and most unique custom car configurations while Brad McGonigle can wax lyrical about how it feels to drive the entire Porsche lineup as part of "the greatest job in the world." In the shop, Manfred Werner and his Porsche Classic-certified colleague Keith, work away at London's complete in-house

restoration of a '73 911 Sportomatic - at least until their local 918 comes in and puts another of Keith's qualifications to work. Turn to Parts & Service, and Brad Van Bakel will help you find an elusive tie rod for your manual-racked 944 while Service Manager Mike Salter enthuses about air-cooled engines with a fellow 930 driver in the lounge.


In all, Porsche of London employs a team of twentysix, including six Product Specialists and four technicians, as well as a bevy of skilled peers who work with them to ensure that everything runs effectively. It is clearly a tight-knit family and it comes as little surprise that so many of its members trace their roots back to its beginning.

Asked about the store's success through the first half of 2017, Steve gestures around to his colleagues who

he credits with establishing a firm foundation through the end of 2016. He also credits helpful guidance from above, such as the steering encouragement of Dealer Principal Chris Leavens (who came of age in his father's VW and Audi stores), as well as goal-setting and advisory sessions led by Pfaff's James Coates. Finally he credits the cars: "People still see so many of the older vehicles on the road and on social media, and it really helps to show and establish the value of the Porsche brand."

Looking to the future, Steve beams with optimism. "It won't be long before we outgrow this place," he suggests with a smile. As UCR's southwestern activity has demonstrated, a vast (and growing) community of Porschephiles exists beyond the bounds of the GTA. We thank Porsche of London for their support, and we look forward to seeing their team grow in the years to come.


The third item of the business was to confirm the appointment of Collins Barrow Toronto LLP as Auditor for the financial year ending December 31, 2017.

Mark Solomon: **Restoring and** backdating a fire-damaged 1980 Porsche 911SC

his car was discovered after it was sitting outside for about 4 years. There had been a fire in the rear that damaged the RS rear quarter and melted all wiring and anything else in its path rendering the car inoperable. The owner had hoped that a friend could have it repaired but realizing the cost for the repairs the friend declined and had it stored at his used car lot.

I stumbled upon it during my Christmas school break when looking for a replacement vehicle for my Volvo daily driver. Let's just say that I am still driving that same vehicle

daily with close to 400 000km.

This was the perfect platform for my next project that would keep me out of trouble for a few years. I've never liked the bulky look of the impact bumpers and decided that a full restoration of the exterior with a backdate to look like the classic pre 73 body style was what I wanted. I also replaced


everything on the inside but the dash, gauges and the door panels which will be replaced shortly. The engine was re-

moved not once but 3 times to sort out all of the electrical and mechanical issues, then to install individual throttle bodies with a new EFI system to replace the finicky CIS system that was original equipment for the car. The rear suspension and anything else that was removed from the

vehicle was bead blasted then re-zinced or powder coated and now looks like new. This is my second 911 project and it has been 4 years of steady exciting work with the odd bit of frustration mixed in.

My original 993 will stay with me but I think that when this 911SC is complete it will be sold so that I can afford my next project which will also

Now you see it, now you don't.

started out as an auto mechanic apprentice at a Chrysler dealership in the GTA and obtained my Mechanic's License after completing the required training and classroom education.

Working at the dealership, I saw many new, preowned and client's cars coming in with minor dents and scratches. Some owners cared about their cars enough to ask the dealership to have the dents and scratches fixed. They contracted the service and I saw many experts come in and fix these minor repairs and it intrigued me to learn the trade. I joined Dent Doctor in 1995 and it took me about one year to be able to do a good job. It took me almost three years to feel that I had mastered the trade. Seriously, it is a very complicated process to learn and one that looks so simple when watching a master of the trade working on a damaged car. It is almost an art form and definitely very technical, just as technical, in fact, as repairing engines or transmissions or doing traditional collision repairs.

I bought my own franchise and about ten years from the time I started down this career path, I bought the Canadian company, Dent Doctor. My business has grown very well and we now service Porsche dealers in the GTA, Mercedes Benz corporate locations, Audi, Bentley, BMW, and many more dealerships and body shops. Due to the corporate nature of our business, we stopped making house calls to individual customers many years ago. However, we still offer direct service to customers if they bring their car to our workshop that is centrally located in Thornhill where our team of five technicians attends to your car on a drop in or scheduled appointment.

How do we do it? Sheet metal, both steel and aluminum, remains malleable even though it has been die formed into the doors, fenders, hoods and other body parts that make our cars look sleek and beautiful. Sheet metal dents when a foreign object impacts. Paint finishes scratch when a foreign object makes abrasive contact. Composite materials deform and scratch for the same reason. Fixing minor damage on steel is completely different from aluminum and different again when it comes to composites like thermoplastics.

We begin by placing different specialized lights of different colour temperatures on the damaged surface to assist us to see the dent, scratch or damage by following reflections along the surface that are never easy to spot under general illumination in a workshop or even outdoors in bright sunlight. Once we have identified the damage and can see it clearly, we clean the area using a high-density lubricant infused wash spray that lifts up any surface contaminants. We dry with special microfiber towels that lift and remove surface contaminants that are suspended away from the surface of the car by the spray. We work in a dust free environment at our workshop and find a similarly dust free location at all dealerships where we do our magic.

The secret to dent removal is leverage... the basic principles of Physics you learned in high school with that most basic machines, the lever. Let's look at the definition of a lever:

A lever is a machine consisting of a beam or rigid rod pivoted at a fixed hinge, or fulcrum. ... A lever amplifies an input force to provide a greater output force, which is said to provide leverage. The ratio of the output force to the input force is the mechanical advantage of the lever.


We use this mechanical advantage to minutely manipulate the dent from either side while relieving pent-up stress within the damage. We then can take advantage of larger or wider movements of our hands, holding the tools we employ, that move the opposite end of the tool beyond the fulcrum point in almost microscopic proportions at much stronger, but precise pressure to relieve the damage.











Ironically, not everyone can repair every kind of dent. I may border on conceit if I were to say that I could tackle every type of dent. Other technicians on our team have demonstrated they can repair some types of dents better than I can ever dream of achieving! Each of our team members displays a particular strength in being able to perfectly repair the damage to the point of being able to say: "Now you see it, now you don't!"

Our customers are truly amazed at the results and we take before and after photos for many dents we repair so that the owner can see what it was and how it disappeared.



Paintless dent removal is a science as well because manufacturers of automobiles use various grades of specifications for the materials used to build their cars. We don't need these specifications, but as we work through a high volume of vehicles, we are able to understand the variations in metals and composites. We use this acquired knowledge of each model to pick the right tool for the job when we approach each dent.

An S-Class Mercedes uses different specification body parts than a C-Class. Porsches are no different and with models now being built in four factories, the specifications of a Cayenne is vastly different from that of a 911 or a 718.


Now that you have some knowledge, don't procrastinate to have even the smallest dent removed from your Porsche. It will bring a smile not a frownto your face every time you go to your car. It is a simple process and well worthwhile doing.




unlight fades with each passing day, leaves begin to colour before surrendering entirely and giving into gravity, temps plummet on a steady unrelenting drop, the sad reality of hibernation for many Porsche sports cars creeps closer, so it was time for one more blast through Niagara on a new route—the Niagara Autumn Colours Fun Run.


Several club members kept the good times rolling by relaxing with refreshments on Peller's outdoor patio which would be closing for the season after this weekend.

In the past Del Bruce has gone from Worker Assignments to managing the DE portion of the hugely successful Driven 2 Smile charity event. He's adept at organizing the sheer volume of people and all of their special needs, while keeping everything moving on a schedule. I still don't know how he does it, but I suspect that he could herd cats if you asked him to. In Andy's absence from the role, Del will assume the position of Attitude Adjuster at

the track. So anyone who doesn't think the rules apply to them may want to rethink their position. Del doesn't suffer fools very easily.

While I'm mentioning rules I thought I would bring up the "Non-Porsche Rule" and revue it with everyone. This rule is located with all the other DE information on the club website under the Driver Education tab and predates me. First and foremost this is a Porsche Club and anyone who isn't an Instructor is considered a Student. Our Instructors volunteer to teach the handling dynamics of Porsches to their owners, not ride around in a rusty Toyota Tercel or even a brand new Lambo. The rule is clear; there are no non-Porsches allowed in the Instructed groups. Very rare exceptions can be made but the participant must apply for the exemption on a one-time basis if their Porsche has become unavailable for that single event. Bought a Corvette? Join the Corvette Club.

There is always the inevitable argument that some Instructors drive cars at the events that aren't Porsches. There is a very sound reason for that exemption. Many Instructors also race their cars. If they are racing the following weekend and their cars are already prepared, they can't take the chance of breaking it at a DE. They also need to save their tires for the actual race as opposed to just lapping. If we discourage them from coming at all, then we will have fewer Instructors with less students and higher costs for everyone. Without Instructors there is no program to participate in, so they are allowed that exception.

I hope you take the time to examine our 2018 track schedule and sign up for as many events as possible. Registration opens at midnight on New Year's Eve for those who want to be first to sign up. Anyone who is joining us for the first time in 2018 can sign up for as many events as they like, as long as the first one is an Introductory Driving School (IDS) in April. The IDS is a mandatory prerequisite of the DE program, where you learn the basics of car handling. That course helps keep both you and your car safe on the track and insures that everyone has the same basic foundation. It's also a lot of fun, as you slip and slide in complete

The winter will just fly by and soon we'll be approaching another track season, so drive safely in the snow and we'll look forward to sharing the track with you all in 2018.

ingle malt scotch has long been considered the most prestigious of spirits but even connoisseurs would admit that learning to appreciate a fine Scotch could be more of a journey

than something instantaneous. That's where Cameron Millar, the Brand Ambassador for The Macallan, comes in. Millar's job is to travel the country to educate people about The Macallan, sharing knowledge and fine whisky along the way. A dream job, no doubt. "The Macallan is one of the few whiskies in the world that has the ability to change your perception with just a single dram." Millar says. "It's never a tough sell." He's not wrong.

I met Cameron at the Grand Opening Event of Porsche Centre North Toronto and as a long time Scotch enthusiast, we got talking about what makes it all so special. I had asked the right person! And at the right time, as we approach the holiday season when we most likely will think more about celebrations, gifts and good times with friends, families and loved ones. Therefore, I felt this would be a really nice time of year, now that our cars are parked for the season, to nurse our driving itch by turning to other activities that are equally educational and enjoyable.

Millar prides himself on being a Scotch whisky educator. Although loyal to his employer - he discussed everything from how to best enjoy a whisky, to how it's made, to the things that make, of course, The Macallan, one of the most adored whiskies in the world. Many people think there's only one correct way to enjoy a fine Scotch whisky like The Macallan: neat. Millar said. "I always say that there's no wrong way to enjoy a whisky. It is up to the in-

dividual and their personal taste. There are some whiskies that open up quite nicely with a little bit of water added. Others stand up beautifully in a classic cocktail." Millar also countered some of the key myths about Scotch whisky and how to consume it. Such as the desire to 'swirl' your glass of whisky like one would a fine glass of wine before nosing it - caution - the higher alcohol by volume leads to an unpleasant noseful of alcohol, which can turn someone off of the liquid entirely! Another myth: older whisky is always better - The Macallan offers a broad range of both age statement and non-age statement whiskies. Over the past several years they have

been pioneers in educating consumers on how to evaluate a whisky beyond just the number on the label and instead looking for other cues like the colour of the liquid. Unlike many other whisky producers, the Macallan adds no caramel colouring to the whisky, so the colour offers clues to both the taste profile as well as the production process.

Millar could speak endlessly on The Macallan's rich history and unique production processes. It is after all, these key components that set The Macallan apart from other single malt distilleries. Their rich history begins in Speyside, often considered the heart of Scotch whisky country. ter the casks that so heavily impact their character. The Macallan Rare Cask, which is available across Canada and retails for approximately \$400, is derived from less than 1% of all casks aging at The Macallan. The Macallan Master Distiller, Bob Dalgarno, has the enviable job of assessing the whisky in each of these casks and sets aside the cream of the crop (less than 1,000 in total) to create The Macallan Rare Cask. It's a beautiful and rich dram, with notes of raisin and cinnamon on the nose and spices and vanilla on the palate. In contrast, there is The Macallan Double Cask which contains a mix of whisky aged in American oak casks and European oak casks, each sherry seasoned. The result is a perfectly balanced whisky, with butterscotch, toffee, citrus and wood spices coming to the forefront. Available across Canada, for approximately \$100 a bottle.

When asked what Millar loves most about his experiences as a brand ambassador, he doesn't hesitate to

answer. "It's the people". Isn't that a familiar theme? There is something about sharing a good whisky in good company that brings people together, just as we gather at track and social events to share the pleasures of driving P-cars. Knowing that many of you have parked your cars and will go on to enjoy reading the December issue of Provinz, with possibly a dram at hand, is as rewarding to this volunteer editor as Cameron said it was for him to know that those who try The Macallan with their own friends and family and share a similar experience, is what makes what he does so rewarding". And so do I, in bringing you *Provinz* every

month for your reading enjoyment and as a reference source for club activities.

Cheers (or Slàinte as the Scots would say) to that.

"It seems complicated, but after a while, they get quite good at mastering the moves and getting into the elevator before it is full."


New officers have now been elected to the Board. They must take careful note of the protocol at these important meetings. We wish them well in their endeavours.


